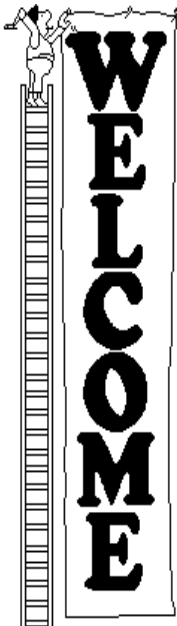

A WORD OF WELCOME

We are pleased to welcome you to Planeview Place. As a resident of this facility, you are one of the important people here. This Handbook was prepared to assist you and your family with required information to make your move and stay a little easier.

ACCOMMODATION

Planeview Manor was opened in 1963 with 32 rooms. 22 more rooms were added in 1985 and the beautiful Recreational Centre was opened in 1989. A major upgrade was completed in 1998 and 19 new lodge rooms were added. Planeview Place was opened in 2004 with 28 one-bedroom Supportive Housing Suites and 19 additional lodge rooms, creating a facility with a total of 121 units.

The studio rooms can be furnished with a bed/headboard, night table, chest of drawers, side chair and draperies or you can bring your own furniture. Bed linens and towels are provided. You may also bring in additional furnishings such as an easy chair and television. Other items may need the approval of the Manager.

The Supportive Housing Suites are unfurnished to permit you to bring your own furniture with you.

ACCOMMODATION FEE PAYMENT

Accommodation fees are due by the first day of each month. Payment is preferred to be made by Direct Debit. Post-dated cheques made payable to **Leduc Foundation** will be accepted. See the Receptionist.

HOUSEKEEPING & LINEN: _____

The housekeeping service is provided on a weekly basis. You will be given a designated day that your room will be cleaned each week. In addition to cleaning each week, the housekeeping staff will change your bed linens and provide clean towels.

PERSONAL LAUNDRY SERVICE: _____

A personal laundry service is available for a \$35 monthly fee. Staff will launder your clothing once a week. A laundry bag will be provided for your clothes. If you would like to personalize your clothes, the housekeeping staff will lend you a permanent marker. You will be asked to drop your laundry off at a designated location on a specific day each week. See the office staff if you would like this service.

If you wish to do your own laundry, there is a Resident Laundry Room located in the South Wing and on each of second and third floor of Planeview Place.

VEHICLE & SCOOTER PARKING: _____

Parking stalls are available with plug-ins, as well as an indoor scooter storage room. A \$15 fee is charged.

TELEVISION

Cable T.V. is available for a \$26.00 per month. The digital box located in your room is property of Planeview and subject to a \$300 charge if removed from the room.

FRIDGE HOOK UP

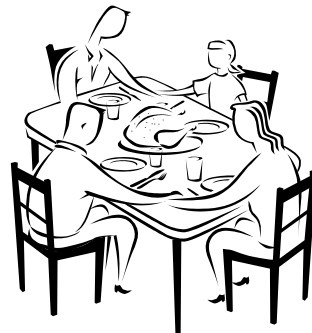
A small fridge is permitted in your room if they wish. A \$5.00 for electricity will be charged.

DINING ROOM

Planeview serves healthy and nutritious meals three times a day, as well as a snack in the morning, afternoon and evening. A Salad Bar is available at dinner and supper meals. Coffee, tea, juice, milk, water and fresh fruit are available 24 hours a day on a self-serve basis. Meals are served to the resident at the table at:

Supportive Housing Residents receive 1 meal and 3 snacks. Residents shall attend meals in the dining room unless ill. In this case they will be provided their meal by a staff member for up to 3 days. If you plan to be away for a meal, please

inform the kitchen staff at least two hours prior to your departure.

GUEST MEALS

If your friends or family would like to join you for a meal, they are more than welcome. Please advise the kitchen staff at least two hours prior to the meal. A small fee is charged per guest:

GUEST ACCOMMODATION

A guest suite is available for overnight accommodation for a maximum of one week. Cost, excluding meals, \$35 single, \$60 double per day/night.

FACILITY BOOKINGS

The Private Dining Room is available for you to use (maximum 15 people). Your event can be catered with coffee/tea/juice, plates, cups and final clean-up for a small fee of \$25. Your event can also be catered with a full meal service at the applicable guest meal cost per person. The Recreation Centre is also available for rent, Sundays from 1-4pm for a fee of \$50. Please book with two (2) weeks notice through the Receptionist.

MAIL BOXES

Mailboxes are located in the Evanson Lounge and beside the Main Entrance fireplace. The number of your mailbox will be the same as your room number, and you will be supplied with a key. Outgoing mail can be left in the Outgoing mail box in Evanson lounge or in the tray at the Reception counter. Stamps (limit of 4) are available from the Receptionist.



RESIDENT-STAFF RELATIONS

Leduc Foundation employees are required to maintain an “arms length” relationship with each resident to protect against favouritism, wrongdoing, or the perception from developing. Employees may not participate in a resident’s business affairs including such matters as borrowing or lending money or acting as Executor to a Will or assisting in writing a Will. Residents are asked to use their own legal counsel or the Public Trustee, so that their business affairs are handled properly. An employee is also not able to run errands or do favours for a resident.

An employee shall not conduct business with any resident, i.e., an employee shall not buy or sell anything from/to a resident. In addition, an employee is not permitted to exchange an individual gift or money with a resident for any reason.

MONITORING

The status of each resident will be confirmed at each meal. Residents, who wish to miss breakfast and not be disturbed, can enter into an agreement to decline being checked in the morning.

EMERGENCY PENDANT

Each resident is provided with a pendant that when activated notifies the staff that they need emergency assistance. The pendant must be returned when you move out, or pay a replacement fee of \$190.00

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Leduc Foundation staff members are trained to respond to emergency situations to protect the safety of all persons in Leduc Foundation facilities and to minimize possible damage to Leduc Foundation facilities. Planning and procedures are in place to respond to:

- Fire
- Tornado
- Gas Leak
- Loss of Utilities
- Loss of Water
- Flooding
- Pandemic
- Municipal Disaster

Drills will be conducted at least annually, more often as required for specific emergency responses (e.g., fire drills).

Residents and their families are asked to become familiar with the Fire Response Plan located on or by, the resident room door and cooperate with staff during emergency response measures.

PROBLEM RESOLUTION

In the event there is a need to resolve a difference in interpretation, application, or administration of any Foundation policy you are asked to discuss your concern with the Manager. The Manager may be able to resolve the matter or alternately, may take it to the Executive Director. The matter will normally be taken to higher offices until it is resolved or a final decision is made.

Where there is perceived involvement of the Site Manager and/or staff in illegal acts or activities detrimental to the Foundation, you are asked to report your concerns directly to the Executive Director or Chairman of the Board.

NO SMOKING POLICY

Smoking is **NOT** permitted in your room. A designated Smoking Room is available across from the Main Dining Room.

SECURITY – DOORS LOCKED

The main door is locked at 11:00 p.m. If you have visitors that are late in leaving, please inform the Evening Attendant working in the kitchen. This also applies if you find you are going to be late returning to Planeview. A doorbell is located by the front door to alert staff if you return after the doors are locked.

HOME CARE

Home Care services are available to you while living at Planeview. Please see the Manager for more information, or contact Home Care directly at 496-1300.

FOOT CARE

A Podiatrist visits Planeview every six weeks and holds a clinic in the Hairdressing Salon in the Evanson Lounge. An appointment sheet is put out a few days prior to his visit. The cost is \$8.00 per visit and is payable directly to the Foot Doctor on the day of your appointment.

BEAUTY SALON

The Hairdresser is available Thursdays from 8 a.m. to 12:00 noon and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (except on holidays). The Salon is located in the Evanson Lounge. Price list is posted by the Salon. Book your appointment at the Salon.



LIBRARY



Located off the Evanson Lounge, the Library boasts reading selections for everyone's taste, comfortable seating in an air conditioned environment.

PLANEVIEW RESIDENTS' CLUB

As a resident of Planeview you are automatically a member of the Club. This Non-Profit Club meets once per month to plan fund raising events, entertainment and activities for the residents. It is an opportunity for all residents to provide input on the services they receive including meals, housekeeping, and laundry. Information sessions are also provided throughout the year.

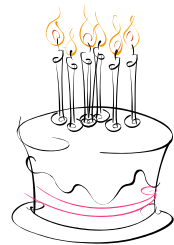
NEWSLETTER
